#### INTRODUCTION

"The time... midsummer. The theatre... South Pacific. Location... South China Sea. The mission... Search and Destroy. "Reveille, reveille, All Hands heave out and thrice up", is heard as the familiar call of the Bo'sn is piped to the crew. And then, "Flight Quarters, Flight Quarters, All Hands man your flight quarters stations". The year?... it could be happening in 1945, or 1966. The important thing is that it is happening now, and it is 1967.

"Aces" of yesterday taught many valuable lessons to the light leaders of today. And today, those lessons are being put to use in every flight over the troubled skies of Vietnam.

Throughout World War II, the fame of INTREPID and her Air Wing grew as their deeds were done in systematic harmony. Once again in 1966 the same team was called upon to confirm its reputation, the efforts of INTREPID and CARRIER AIR WING 10 were matched only by their accomplishments.

Fleet records?... second nature to this grand lady. INTREPID and the men who give her life, proved her abilities were more than had been anticipated. In fact, so outstanding was her performance that the awards flowed as did the power from her giant shafts. The "A's", the "E's", the Departmental awards, the FLATLEY Memorial Award, and the finest grades ever awarded for her operational proficiency all said, she may be the oldest but she is truly the finest.


She ages daily now as the miles she sails tick away; but she has never failed to meet her committments with accurate precision, and she has operated with the minimum of trouble and the maximum of morale. Her reputation upholds the courageous name so proudly bestowed upon her... INTREPID.

Headlines have an affinity for the pilots and the glory they bring with every mission they fly... with their countless tales of heroism and deadly accuracy in the skies over Vietnam. It is with these deeds that the pilot has captured the hearts of America. But, there are also those whose duties from dawn til dawn drag on and on. Their days are occupied with the tedious task of supporting the pilots and their mission those whose duty it is to ready the deck for launch and recovery, to load the cannon that pound off peace, to provide the steam that brings the wind without which, the launch would be lost. And it is also those who support in every mentionable way, the sustinance of a fighting ship.

It is all of this then, that must become the story of this Book...

#### "THE FIRST TIME AROUND..."

"In February, 1966, the U.S. Secretary of Defense, Robert S. Mc NAMARA, told a Washington news conference:

"In order to maintain the attack carrier force of Vietnam, we are... deploying one of the Atlantic-based carriers, the INTREPID, to Southeast Asia.

"Very minor modifications are required on this vessel to permit it to operate light attack aircraft and it can be quickly reassigned to its anti-submarine role. What is involved mainly is a change in the aircraft complement. The anti-submarine air group is being retained in the active fleet, thus giving us the capability to operate the carrier as a CVS on short notice."

Mr. McNAMARA's announcement pointed up the singularity of the assignment—for the first time, a CVS, an anti-submarine warfare aircraft carrier had been assigned the role of a CVA, attack carrier, without permanent redesignation to that status.

And... On May 15, 1966, a new chapter in INTREPID's history was begun, when, for the first time in 20 years, aircraft from Carrier Air Wing 10 were hurled from the deck of the "FIGHTING I" to strike the enemy.





Captain William J. McVey

Captain William J. McVey assumed command of INTREPID in June 1967 after commanding USS SYLVANIA.

Born in Lambert, Mississippi, Captain McVey attended Mississippi State University and is a graduate of the U. S. Naval Academy, and the National War College in Washington, D.C.

Captain McVey served in action in the Pacific during WW II. Designated a Naval Aviator in 1945, he flew 116 combat missions in Korea and earned five Air Medals and a Letter of Commendation for his achievements.

Captain McVey has commanded Fighter Squadron 91, Fighter Squadron 124, and was embarked aboard USS ENTERPRISE when Nuclear Task Force ONE made its famous world cruise in 1964.

Commander Thomas D. Brown assumed duties as INTREPID's Executive Officer in July 1967 after serving as the ship's Weapons Officer.

Before reporting to INTREPID, Commander Brown commanded Fleet Composite Squadron TEN.

Commissioned and designated a Naval Aviator in 1944, Commander Brown is a graduate of The Citadel and the Armed Forces Staff College. He served as a Fighter Pilot in the Pacific during WW II, later served as Executive Officer of the U. S. Air Force's 83rd Fighter Squadron.

Decorated five times, Commander Brown wears the Distinguished Flying Cross and six campaign ribbons.

Captain John Warren Fair reported to INTREPID from the Staff of Commander, Naval Air Force, Atlantic, where he served as Assistant Chief of Staff, Readiness.

Born at Big Point, Mississippi, Captain Fair began his career as a Marine at Quantico, Virginia in 1940.

As a fighter pilot in WW II, he earned the Silver Star, Air Medal with Gold Star, Navy Unit Citation, and the designation "Ace" for downing five enemy aircraft.

Captain Fair served as **Commanding**Officer of INTREPID from July 1966 to
June 1967.

Captain Joseph Rezzarday Jr., served as INTREPID'S Executive Officer from August 1966 until July 1967. Reporting aboard in November 1965, he was the ship's Navigator before assuming the added responsibilities of X.O.

Prior to reporting to the INTREPID, Captain Rezzarday was the Commanding Officer of Airborne Early Warning Squadron TWELVE.

Commissioned and designated a Naval Aviator in 1945, Captain Rezzarday was promoted to his present rank in July of 1967.



The Dentist got a hold on me. I'm sure glad I didn't have any problems.






But as regular as clock work, the paymaster came around so there was compensation after all

The new Captain seemed like a great gent...he came from Mississippi too.





I finally decided it was time to do what that Career Counselor suggested...I went down to Disbursing to make out a Savings Allotment. There was an officer there doing the same thing.







Once we did get into port, I hit the tour trail.




Hong Kong was a beautiful city from a distance. But it was here that I began to realize what I ''really'' had back home.







One day while on the line an unidentified surface contact came on the radar scope.







## YANKEE STATION TEAM OPERATIONS, AND HOW IT'S DONE Sometimes on the surface, the coordination attained in operating aircraft make getting the job done seem easy and at times, almost effortless. Such is not the case. Many hours of planning, briefing, decision making, aircraft and ordnance handling, are involved in getting the strike aircraft on the target and back home again safely. Once done, the mission must be de-briefed and evaluated to determine if objectives were met or whether restrikes are necessary. Follow them in color through the next few pages...what it does take to get the job done as a member of YANKEE TEAM. TTY MG I TOO NOT LEAN ON KEYSOARD



This message is delivered immediately to the Ship's Operations Officer who sets in motion, the necessary chain of events to complete the required strikes.




The Commanding Officer is briefed by members of the Operations staff concerning targets, weather, ships desired position and Logistics.




The Skipper is also informed of ammunition requirements and of what servicing requirements may be needed by our accompaning Destroyers.




Even before dawn, the Aircraft Handling Officer and his assistants are planning the deck spots, checking fuel loadings, and varifying launch weights for catapult launches.



In Flight Deck control, squadron maintenance activity grows as minor gripes are written off and aircraft are placed in an up status for the launch.

Meanwhile below decks, the strike group assembles for the first time to receive last minute intelligence briefings on anti-aircraft gun emplacements and missile sights.



The Air Wing Commander who will lead the strike, spells out what tactics will be used in the target area to maintain a coordinated effort. He specifies which squadron or flight element will strike what aim point in the target complexes.





On the flight deck the tempo starts to grow as ordnance handlers prepare and position carts of bombs for loading



Suddenly a rain shower lets go and makes the flight look like a piece of glass. Some manage to don foul weather gear in time...others just have to get wet because the work can't stop



Aircraft brought up from the Hangar Deck



The last aircraft to be spotted moves toward the catapults



With all aircraft in place there is nothing to do now but await the pilots



Back in their ready rooms now, pilots brief their individual flights on close tactics



From Air Operations comes the final weather, ships position and final time of launch.






With debriefings over, pilots can now relax until the strike results are in.

The results of one particilar mission was the near total destruction of an Army Barracks as seen above. Although these pages have dealt with the conduct of only one mission...what you have seen is repeated several times a day for periods approaching 30 days at a time. Although it was not possible to show all the functions that are involved in the total conduct of a YANKEE TEAM strike...many who remain unsung are involved. The Engineers, the Administrative Personnel, Supply and others. In every phase that was represented in color will remain that effort of those who are not in picture but yet vital to the effort.




